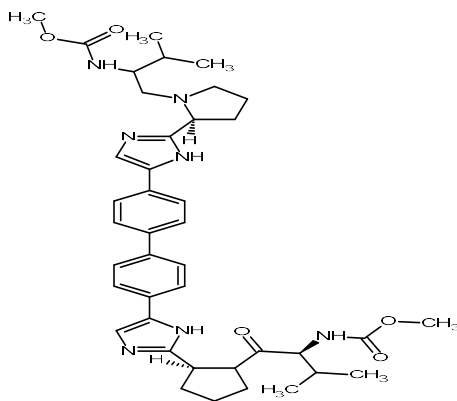
Suppl. Table1 — 2D Structures of the selected drugs

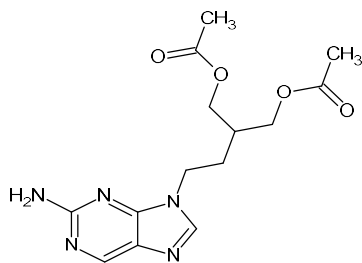
It is an antiviral medication to Influenza.

Daclatasvir



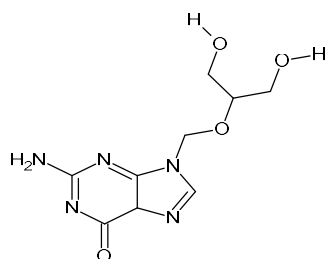
It is used to treat the Hepatitis B virus.

Famciclovir



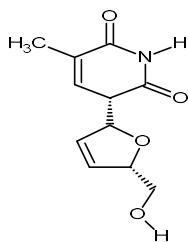
It treats shingles caused by herpes zoster.

Ganciclovir



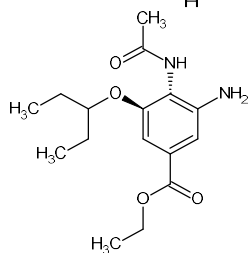
It is used to prevent disease caused by Cytomegalovirus.

Stavudine



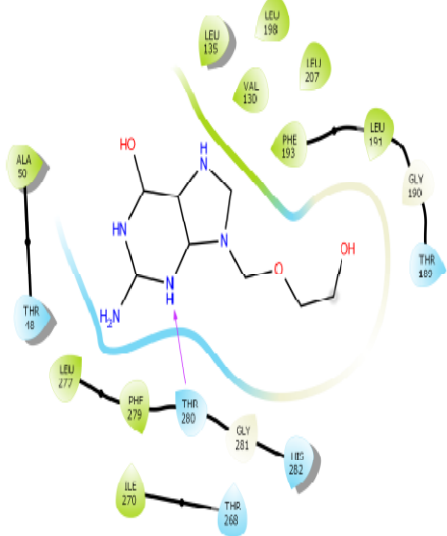
It is used for HIV infection.
